

# Peru 2015

## Mission Trip Information Sheet

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**Where:** Fly into Lima, Peru then travel to Cabana, Peru

**Dates:** March  
May  
October

**Team Size:** 4 people per team minimum — 8 maximum  
To join a team, please contact Allyson Suydam by February 11.

**Projects:** Continue building relationships with villagers  
Engage local people in their everyday life

**Trip Cost:** \$1500 per person (Dependent on airfare)

**Lodging:** We will stay at a hostel in Cabana called Hotel Yuly. It is rustic but clean. Any ladies on the trip will hopefully get to share the room that has a very rustic but clean toilet and shower in the room.

**Meals:** We will be eating in the villages and will purchase bottled water for the team. You should bring your own snacks / dry food and plan for your breakfast. We can heat water so oatmeal is a good option or you can purchase food / meals there very inexpensively (\$1 or \$2 US).

**Transportation:** This trip includes plane, bus, vans and cab rides. The bus ride for the first 8 hours is comfortable. The van ride is for the last 3 hours.

**Required Immunizations:**

The following vaccines are required for this trip:

- Tetanus/Diphtheria or Tetanus/Diphtheria with Whooping Cough

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### **Trip Requirements:**

- Trip Training — We will customize dates for training based on the team departure date
- Completed & Notarized Missions Application
- 3 Color Copies of your Passport page that has your photo and ID information
- Minors Only – Completed & Notarized Parental Consent & Medical Release Form — If you have a current copy on file with Image Student Ministry or another ministry at the church, please just let us know!

Note: We would be happy to notarize documents and make photocopies for you for free! Please make sure that you bring valid ID if you need us to notarize the paperwork for you.

### **Additional Information:**

- Passports are required! Make sure your passport is still active and will not expire less than 3 months after your scheduled return from Peru.
- You can buy just about anything in the village. Food, toiletries, and clothes – you name it and it can probably be found.
- They have good restaurants in the village.
- It is very, very cheap to live in the village.
- The municipal building has an internet café. It works most of the time.
- There is a store that has phone booths that will make international calls. They cost less than 5 cents a minute to use.
- It will be cold as soon as the sun starts going down. You will get used to it, though.
- You can buy good water in the village.
- The electricity in the village is not like the electricity in the US. You will need to check your electric items to make sure that they can handle the 240 volts/50Hz – you can find this information on the power adapter.
- You can wash your clothes by hand (detergent can be bought in the store) or you can pay the owners of the hostel and they will use their washing machine and then hang the clothes to dry.
- We have padlocks that you can use to lock the doors to your room at the hostel. We have been to the village many times and have had no issues with anything being stolen. Warm clothes are highly recommended.
